School Staffing

Sadly despite us still having this half term of work ahead of us we already have a small group of parents asking various members of staff, for the last couple of weeks, re the plans for September 2017. Our plans for Sept 17 will not be fully announced until later this term. I would like the focus to remain on the term ahead; a very important terms work for final assessments for your child.

What can be shared at this stage is that we have some staff leaving this summer. Mrs Excell (year six), who has been with the school since 2009 is leaving to take up supply work to offer her more flexibility for her family. Mrs Loughlin (cover teacher) is retiring this year in order to travel (lucky her!). Miss Sargeant (Reception year) leaves us to explore opportunities outside of teaching and Miss Glewis (year two) is moving onto a local school at Colliers Green.

I'm positive you will join our school team in wishing them well in their next steps and thank them for their dedication to the school, especially Mrs Loughlin who has been here since the start of my headship positively supporting the journey the school has been on.

In the last few weeks we have had various applicants' tour the school, with some interviewed for a potential post. I'm very pleased to share that we are fully staffed for September. In addition you should know that, as a school leader, I am personally very pleased with the appointments; especially when I reflect on our current needs towards our next OFSTED inspection. The full team of staff for September 2017 will be shared with you alongside your child's Report Target updates and latest attainment detail which is due home on July 14th.

School finances

You will have, no doubt, heard various news items about the financial position that schools are currently facing. The Government response to this area each time states that schools have never been so well funded. This may well be a fact, but it also needs to be stated that as a basic that needed to happen due to the growing child population. Simple really! What is not discussed publically enough is the amount of extra financial responsibilities each individual school now needs to cover that were once the responsibility of the Local Authority or even central Government without an increase within a school budget. Having discussed this with my colleague head teachers some of them have to take drastic action and are cutting staff costs to enable them to finance their school for September. When Mrs Excell and Mrs Loughlin leave us in July their posts will not be replaced; we will cover this internally. There will need to be some other changes in the year ahead so that the school is able to cover its costs.

Kent Test

The Kent Test window is now open for year five parents wishing their child to sit this test. I met some parents last week to discuss this test and school results. If any year five parents still need to do this please make contact via the office, or catch up with me when I'm on parking duty!
